Telford Grooming Gangs and Tommy Robinson



I would like to express my perspective. I believe Tommy Robinson is sincerely invested in the well-being of the victims and survivors of child sexual abuse. He is evolving in his understanding, acknowledging his shortcomings and the way he is perceived by others. He is aware that he might not be the ideal person to address this issue, as it should remain a political. His efforts are commendable, and no one else is

undertaking this work to the same degree.

My primary focus is on the survivors, the victims, and the children, and Tommy Robinson is making a positive impact for them.

If you have reservations about Tommy, I recommend watching Episode 3 featuring Sarah, which illustrates how he now supports her. Initially, she wanted nothing to do with him due to his political views, but after viewing earlier episodes of The Rape of Britain, she reached out to him for a conversation.

Sarah escaped at the age of 13, approximately a decade ago, to live with a 42-yearold man, her abuser. She became pregnant at 14 and received no assistance from social services or law enforcement. What is happening within those organizations? Despite having a substantial police file, Sarah was not interviewed during the 2013 police investigation, Operation Chalice, into child abuse in Telford. The cycle of abuse has persisted for generations, yet many victims remain unsupported, and perpetrators are rarely held accountable. Why is this the case?

The Independent Inquiry Report on Telford Child Sexual Exploitation was published on July 12, 2022. This marked the release of the Crowther Report, which addresses the issue of child sexual exploitation in Telford. Link <u>here</u>

The presence of a racial component in this abuse is indisputable. The primary objective must be to eradicate child sexual abuse and trafficking, support the survivors, and hold the offenders accountable. Why is this not occurring? Tommy Robinson is taking action, regardless of your views on his intentions. What actions are you taking?

Racism or the perception of racism should not serve as a justification for permitting child sexual abuse and trafficking to persist.

Organised abuse has been documented as far back as the 1970s.

On May 10, 2013, the BBC reported the conclusion of Operation Chalice, a significant child sex abuse case. On the same day, Telford was confronted with its own child sex abuse issues, as highlighted by the Shropshire Star, which noted that a gang was sentenced for the sexual exploitation of young <u>girls. (1)</u>

On May 22, 2013, Channel 4 aired a feature by Tazeen Ahmad titled "Britain's Sex Gangs." (2)

In 2016, Operation Chalice continued to address these serious concerns.

By December 10, 2017, the Independent reported that British-Pakistani researchers indicated that 84% of grooming gang members were of Asian descent, emphasizing the importance of discussing this issue. (3)

On March 11, 2018, the Mirror revealed what it described as Britain's most severe child grooming scandal, detailing the horrific abuse of hundreds of young girls, including instances of rape, violence, and even murder. (4)

On March 13, 2018, the Shropshire Star revisited Telford's troubling history of child sex abuse allegations.

On March 19, 2018, the chief of West Mercia Police responded to claims regarding the Telford abuse, labelling them as "simply not true." (5)

On January 6, 2020, researchers Ella Cockbain and Waqas Tufail published a study addressing the narrative surrounding "Muslim grooming gangs," arguing that it perpetuates harm and fails to support victims. <u>(6)</u>

In December 2020, a report was released detailing the characteristics of group-based child sexual exploitation.

On January 29, 2022, Tommy Robinson presented "The Rape Of Britain – Nicole's Story."

This was followed by two more episodes in May and June 2022, focusing on the systemic issues surrounding child exploitation.

On July 12, 2022, the Crowther Report was released, stemming from an independent inquiry into child sexual exploitation in Telford, which concluded that the abuse had persisted for generations, as reported by the BBC. (7)
