

Alphonse & Axel Rudakubana

In 2002, Alphonse obtained legal immigration status in the UK, which contradicts the viral tweets from November suggesting that Keir Starmer played a role in halting his deportation. A review of the publicly accessible documents, including court records, revealed that they were poorly formatted Word files, leading me to suspect that they may have been altered to promote a particular narrative, thereby obscuring the true underlying issues at play.

The Rwandan Army's expectation of lifelong commitment renders it unusual for members of Rwandan society to voluntarily exit the military and pursue civilian opportunities abroad. Even following his discharge, it is likely that he continued to be monitored by the Rwandan authorities, and his successful relocation to the UK suggests that he is part of Rwanda's ruling elite.

I have confirmed through documentation in Rwanda that Alphonse is not a member of the Hutu tribe nor is he associated with any opposition party within the Tutsi tribe. In reality, he is the nephew of Wellars Gasamagera, who serves as the Secretary General of the ruling party in Rwanda, the RPF. This party consists of a chairman, a vice chairman, and the Secretary General, forming the inner circle that makes all key decisions.

Upon arriving in the UK, Alphonse continued to practice karate, which raises questions, particularly in light of allegations that he could have been dispatched to the UK as an operative. His involvement in karate might have served as a façade for his actual intentions.

According to local information and Alphonse, was released from Kagame's army due to his age and anger management issues. His past may have influenced his son Axel's violent behaviour in Southport. Given Rwanda's history, particularly the 1994 genocide, questions arise about who taught Axel about genocide and knife skills. These inquiries are especially relevant as Axel faces serious charges, including three counts of murder, a terrorism-related offence, and producing the toxic substance ricin.

The Rwandan Army takes great pride in its reputation as "killing machines," asserting that the younger generation possesses even greater proficiency in combat than their predecessors. It is therefore unsurprising that Axel, the son of one of these "killing machines," has followed in his father's footsteps and embraced a life of violence, especially considering his father's history and the prevailing cultural environment in Rwanda.



Axel, who perpetrated the egregious crime in Southport, had a documented history of violence. He was expelled from school for possessing a knife and for voicing extremist opinions, including the belief that the UK "needed a genocide like they had in Rwanda to resolve its issues," as reported by a former classmate. Authorities, including police and social services, were familiar with him, yet it remains uncertain whether they were aware of his father's background in the Rwandan Army and his great uncle who is part of the Rwandan ruling party..

Where did Axel acquire the notion of genocide? Who instructed him in the use of a knife? His violent behaviour did not emerge spontaneously; it likely involved some form of training. Therefore, it is essential to consider who may have provided that training. These inquiries warrant further investigation.

Rwandan President Paul Kagame began his military journey young, in a culture where children often witness violence and idolise authoritarian figures, fostering violent behaviours. The issue of child soldiers in African conflicts, including Rwanda, is welldocumented, and Alphonse likely faced significant impacts from his experiences. Growing up in an environment that conditions individuals to commit atrocities can perpetuate a cycle of violence, influencing future generations. It's not surprising that a child of a former child soldier might be affected by their father's traumatic past.

So how is all this linked with the UK ties to Rwanda and why would this want to be hidden from the UK public?

Former MI5 anti-terrorism officer David Shayler claimed Tony Blair worked for MI5 before he became Labour Party leader in 1994, suggesting a connection to the UK deep state.

Blair was Prime Minister from 1997 to 2007. After leaving office, he proposed a charity initiative with Rwanda's authoritarian leader Kagame to integrate Western experts into African ministries. In February 2008, Blair visited Rwanda to provide unpaid policy advice, and by July 2008, his office had established a team of specialists there. The Ugandan Independent noted that Blair's consultancy approach differed from typical support, with Blair stating, "Our consultancy is not to tell the people of Rwanda what to do, but to help get done what the president wants." Kagame acknowledged the benefits of this collaboration in attracting investments.

In 2010, The Guardian reported that Tony Blair maintained a close relationship with Rwandan leader Paul Kagame, despite international criticism over allegations of war crimes and political repression. Blair called Kagame a "visionary leader" and made Rwanda a focus of his charity, the Africa Governance Initiative (AGI), which placed officials in key Rwandan institutions to assist with governance.



The UK has favoured Kagame, with Blair's former development secretary, Clare Short, directing significant aid to Rwanda, which had recently joined the Commonwealth. In 2011, Blair defended Kagame against human rights abuse allegations, expressing personal trust in him while serving as a personal adviser, with AGI employing about ten staff members in the Rwandan government.

Team Blair, known for their youthful enthusiasm, operates in Rwanda with personnel in the offices of the president, Prime Minister, Ministry of Finance, and the Rwandan Development Board. They travel around mentoring local employees and assisting in policy development, according to The Telegraph.

Funding sources for AGI are unclear, with no contributions from the Rwandan government. Bill Gates's charitable foundation and the Gatsby Charitable Foundation have made significant donations, while the Rothschild family declined to comment on their recent visit to Rwanda.

In 2013, Blair supported Rwanda's role in the Democratic Republic of Congo, denying UN claims of support for the M23 rebel group while still advising President Kagame. However, by 2014, The New York Times reported that Blair's initiatives were hindered by Kagame's damaged reputation due to allegations of brutality, and David Himbara, a former liaison with Blair, had distanced himself from the administration.

David Himbara questioned the positive impact of Blair's charity, given its collaboration with a criminal regime, while Blair defended it by citing Rwanda's progress under Kagame since the genocide. Blair's praise for Kagame is echoed by others, including Bill Clinton, who called him one of "the greatest leaders of our time," and Bill Gates, who has a close working relationship with him. Various governments, including the U.S. and Britain, have also expressed support for Kagame. In April 2021, Kagame participated in a panel with Blair and other leaders to discuss COVID-19's impact in Africa. Himbara noted in October 2021 that Blair and his wife, Cherie, have strong ties to Kagame's administration.

Cherie Blair has been identified as the 'ethics adviser' for the Israeli company NSO Group, which produces the Pegasus Spyware that Kagame uses widely to target African leaders and perceived adversaries, according to Himbara.

The recent agreement between the UK government and Rwanda involves the relocation of immigrants to Rwanda, with the UK committing £140 million to the Kagame administration, without any possibility of reimbursement.

The conclusion I can reach is that Alphonse, who has unresolved anger stemming from his childhood experiences in fighting, utilised karate as a means of coping. However, at home, his son, who exhibited violent tendencies as part of his character, received



training from someone on the proficient use of a knife, knowledge which would have been imparted by his father. This son became radicalised within the home environment and did not engage with any recognised groups focused on developing ricin or accessing related manuals. Additionally, he was educated by his father about genocide, a topic that his great uncle promotes among Rwandan youth globally as part of a government initiative. His father might be considered the outlier within the family, yet the political elite will likely seek to maintain a discreet connection to the ruling party. If this information were to surface, it would necessitate considerable justification, especially given Tony Blair's significant role in influencing the nation alongside a political party that has a reputation for corruption, while taxpayers continue to fund their activities. Don't forget both the Clintons and Gates are closely aligned to the country so it runs deep.

It is essential to remember that three innocent young children tragically lost their lives due to the actions of an individual who was not in control. Meanwhile, the political class appears to prioritise their own careers and financial interests over the well-being of these vulnerable lives. Never forget this point and unless you are prepared to stand up and do something about it then silence gives them carte blanche to continue with no possibility of any action being taken against them.
